I. Program Outline

Rikuzentakata city is in the coastal area in Iwate prefecture located in the northern part of Honshu, main island of Japan. In the 2011 Great East Japan Earthquake, the city was struck by a series of strong earthquakes, followed by tsunamis that reached the height of a five-story building. The disaster had brought over 1,700 lives including missing persons, among 24,246 citizens at that time. The city has worked through the recovery process step by step formulating disaster prevention and preparedness-oriented city plan, and striving to realize a town where the word "normalization" is no longer needed, in other words, a town where everyone can live with hope and peace of mind. After 10 years since the earthquake, the land has been raised approximately 10 meters, and residential land was developed for housing reconstruction. In 2021, the new city hall building was completed on the elevated land, and a new picture of the town is being created. On the other hand, there are many future challenges for new town development and revitalization.

It is important to know how people in Rikuzentakata are dealing with the disaster as the years go by.


Rikkyo University has built a constant communicating forum with Rikuzentakata city before the disaster, and has been managing project-based learning programs with the city since 2013. Through this program, the university hopes to encourage more students to gain an accurate and deep understanding towards the current situation in the devastated area and to share the challenges faced by the town together with the citizens. Besides, with the opportunity of collaborating with students from overseas universities, students will be able to express their learning experiences internationally, as well as to consider different issues in much more various aspects and visions.

Stanford University (2015-), The University of Hong Kong (2018-), and the National University of Singapore (2019-) and other American universities have had students participating in this program.

- · Understand the current situation of the city and the process of recovery in the affected area.
- To share the challenges facing the Rikuzentakata city and its citizens
- Address the issues in wide visions and multiple aspects through discussion with students from overseas universities.

⟨Perspectives on Program Fees⟩

- Participants are to bear Round trip travelling between Tokyo and Rikuzentakata, accommodation, meals for the field trip. The university will collect the program fee in advance. Students need to pay for some meals when eating separately during the program or in group activities.
- Necessary Expenses: Approx. 50,000 60,000 JPY

 This program is eligible for "Rikkyo University Rikuzentakata Satellite Allowance" and the program fee will be collected from each participant after offsetting the amount of the allowance from the necessary expenses.

◆Eligibility for Application (Registration)
All undergraduate students (1st to 4th year, all college and departments)

◆Requirements

 Must be enrolled in the Spring Semester AY2025 (students on leave of absence during the semester are not eligible to participate). Students who are not eligible to take spring semester subjects due to reasons such as studying abroad while enrolled, are not allowed to apply for this course.

- · All participants must participate in the preparation session, field work, and wrap-up session.
- Required to have the capacity and will to communicate in English in the program (there are no standards set for English qualification test scores; however, all programs will be conducted in English, so you are required to be able to hold discussions in English.)

◆Required Documents (Data) for Application

Prepare the following items in advance and upload them according to the instructions on the application form. Submissions will be shared with program administrators along with responses to the form.

(TOEIC IP is acceptable. If a certificate cannot be prepared, a screen copy of the website showing the name of the qualification, name, year and month of the examination, and score is also acceptable. Submit PDF or photo image data)

Selection② Online interview will be conducted for those who passed the selection process in ① to determine the successful candidates.

**Notification of the results of Selection ① and the date and time of the interview will be sent to successful applicants by June 3. Notification of the results will be sent to your Rikkyo domain address.

◆Selection Criteria

The decision on acceptance will be made based on a comprehensive evaluation, including both document screening and interviews. In addition to the applicant's suitability and abilities (such as motivation, English proficiency, and understanding of and suitability for the program), the overall composition and balance of the team will also be taken into consideration.

*Cross-Disciplinary Studies under the University-Wide Liberal Arts Comprehensive Subjects are, in principle, available from the fall semester of the first year onward; however, this course is open to the first-year students

[Number of Credit] 2 credits

[Offered Semester] Summer session AY2025

2. Credit registration and calculation for maximum number of registered courses

• Students who have been selected will be registered by the university. As such, there is no need to go through the registration process yourself, however, be sure to check that the course registration status screen that will be updated after course registration

- This course is a "Summer Session", and the credits taken for it will be counted towards the maximum number of registered credits per year (12 credits) for university-wide liberal arts subjects
 - e.g.) Even if you have already reached the maximum number of registered courses (6 credits) for comprehensive courses in the spring semester, if you have not reached the maximum number of credits (12 credits) for comprehensive courses for the year, and if you have not reached the maximum number of registered courses for the spring semester as determined by your college, you will be able to register for this course after being accepted.
- * If you have any questions about course registration, please check with the Academic Affairs Office in advance before applying.

3. Grade Evaluation

- Students will receive either a "pass" or "fail" as an evaluation for this course. For details on the grading method and percentage, please refer to the syllabus.
- Grades will be assigned only to those who participate in all components: the preparation session, field work, wrap-up session, and who complete all required submissions.
 Even if you are unable to participate in the training due to school-acquired infectious disease or other reasons, grading will be conducted strictly in accordance with the established grading and evaluation criteria. Student who does not participate in the entire on-site training (field trip) will not be eligible for evaluation and will fail the course.
- Due to the schedule of the program, grades are expected to be released later than usual, around late September (after the course registration period for the Fall Semester).

4. Points to Note

- Before applying, applicants must be sure to completely verify all relevant information in the 2025 R-Guide (including details on descriptions of Comprehensive courses and "Taking courses in the Rikuzentakata Project") and syllabus etc.
- · Registration will not be cancelled after the selection acceptance is confirmed.
- Please note that the makeup exam period may overlap with the participation period of this program, which could make it impossible to take the makeup exams. However, participation in this course cannot be used as a reason to alter the official makeup exam schedule. Be sure to check Registration guide (R guide) and consult the Academic Affairs Office if necessary.
- Course registration will not be accepted if the course date and time overlap with another course of the Spring semester fixed term courses (intensive courses, etc.) or Summer Session for which you have already registered.
